

\$900 Million Jury Verdict Handed Down by Los Angeles Jury in Workplace Sexual Assault Case

California Employment Law Update on June 20, 2024

This week a Los Angeles jury awarded a plaintiff nearly \$1 billion in damages for workplace sexual assault. The defendant, billionaire Alkiviades David, suffered a staggering loss when a Los Angeles Superior Court jury doled out a massive \$900 million verdict in favor of David's former employee, who brought suit against him in 2020 alleging years of sexual assault, battery, and harassment. Plaintiff was hired as a "brand ambassador" at one of David's companies and alleged that she was subjected to sexual harassment, sexual assault and rape during the course of her employment. The jury awarded \$100 million in compensatory damages and \$800 million in punitive damages to the former employee and victim, which is thought to be one of the largest verdicts in history in a sexual assault case.
